Happiest of New Years and continuing Christmas blessings! (Remember, Christmas is 12 days!)

This year, in preparing for Christmas, I spent some time pondering the importance of the Incarnation. The Creator God of the universe freely deciding to become a flesh and blood human being. Historically, it has been a bit of stumbling block in our relations with Jews and Muslims. I believe we should certainly work to overcome that stumbling block, but we should also consider what belief in the Incarnation is asking us to focus our hearts and minds on.

Other religions believe their gods took human form for short periods of time, but none that I am aware of did so for the reasons we see our God becoming human. One thing the Incarnation means is that God seeks communion with God's creation: especially humanity. In love, God seeks to bridge the difference between us.

God came to live among us, to be born as one of us, in a time and in a place of fear and hopelessness. At a time when the Jews were ruthlessly oppressed, Jesus Christ was born a Jew. At a time when the haves and have-nots led completely different lives, Jesus Christ was born among the have-nots - poor and helpless.

When we wonder about this world, our answer needs to be based on the fact that God so loved it that he came to live in it.

When we wonder about humanity, our answer needs to be based on the fact that God so loved humanity that he came to live among us and rather than pick and choose who he would feed, heal and forgive, he **freely** fed, **freely** healed and **freely** forgave **all** who came to him.

When we wonder about ourselves and what God asks of us, our answer needs to be based on the fact that God came to serve and **not** be served, and he asks us to love one another as he has loved us.

Just a few thoughts on the Incarnation. Blessings to you all!

Vestry Hi-lights for December

Vestry Meeting, December 18, 2022

- 1. Meeting called to order at 10:50 a.m. by Fr. David after prayer. Present: Fr. David, Tracey Tallmadge, Judy Rettberg, Denise Wieber, Mado Cimini. Absent: Dan & Kerri Vail, Amy Wieber, Woodie Robins.
- 2. The minutes of the October 16, 2022, meeting was reviewed and on a motion by Denise, and seconded by Judy, were approved as presented.
- 3. Outreach: Several suggestions, including "Roots and Wings" a food pantry in Norwich that has a need for funds. Judy noted that the Afton Food Pantry had recently given them a contribution of \$2000. Denise noted that Amy is considering starting a soup and sandwich lunch program. After discussion, a motion was made by Mado that we approve \$100 for seed money and that we support the project with up to \$100 per month for 2023. Seconded by Judy and carried. Details on the project will follow.
- 4. After discussion, a motion was made by Tracey that we give the \$300 for November, to the Afton VFW which is struggling financially. Seconded by Denise and carried.
- 5. For December, a motion was made by Judy that we support the Diocese of Jerusalem, seconded by Tracey, and carried.
- 6. <u>Unfinished business</u>: Decided that we will start Zoom services the first Sunday of January and continue through February. Services will be accessible through St. Ann's website. This should help conserve fuel oil and avoid travel during the winter months.
- 7. Also noted that we will NOT have a service on Christmas day which falls on Sunday this year.
- 8. Fr. David and Mado reported on convention.
- 9. The antifreeze has been purchased for the forced hot water furnace in the Church and will be installed by Mado and Ron Sherman.
- 10. We were not able to have the lawn mowed at Arthur Jones as he could not be contacted to give his permission.
- 11. New Business: UTO ingathering so far is \$247.
- 12. Our Wednesday bible study has a temporary hiatus to support the Diocesan program on racism. Fr. David noted that St. Ann's parish hall might be used for access to our large screen TV for the program.
- 13. Christmas offering was discussed. We have typically given this offering to the General Theological Seminary. After discussion, a motion was made by Tracey and seconded by Denise that we do the same this Christmas, motion carried. The General Theological Seminary publication was available, and it was noted that St. Ann's is the only church in the Diocese of Central New York that has given to the General Theological Seminary.
- 14. A brief report was given on the Stewardship program response. A number of cards have not been returned.



15. The Diocese has sent the figures on our 2023 assessment and suggested pledge. After discussion, a motion was made by Tracey that we return the pledge form agreeing to the figure calculated by the Diocese for our assessment of \$4125 and increasing the pledge figure to \$2490 which gives a total of \$6615.00 or \$551.25 per month. Motion seconded by Mado and carried. Fr. David will send the completed form to the Diocese.

16. There being no other business to transact, a motion was made by Judy that the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Denise, and carried. Meeting adjourned at 11:25 a.m.


